Exhibitor Show Rules and Protocol

This Show will be conducted under the Rules of the Australian Alpaca Association as set out in the current AAA Ltd Showing Rules Manual.

All exhibitors are also required to be familiar with the Administrative Protocol for Exhibitors and Organisers When Attending Victorian Central Region (VCR) Organised Alpaca Shows (Amended 9th April 2008). A copy is available for download from the VCR website (www.vcralpaca.com.au) and Alpaca Colourbration website (www.alpacacolourbration.com.au).

All exhibitors should read the conditions on the entry form and ensure that they can comply with those conditions before signing the entry form, particularly noting the condition dealing with animal health. A separate health declaration form is provided for signature and return with exhibitor's entry forms.

A separate entry form is required for each Stud/Exhibitor. An exhibitor (or his/her authorised agent) must sign the entry form. Failure to sign the entry form will render all alpacas of an exhibitor ineligible to be exhibited.

- 'Exhibitor' means a financial member of the Australian Alpaca Association Ltd in whose herd an entire or wethered animal is registered and is deemed the owner of the animal;
- 'Authorised Agent' means the person authorised to enter animals and fleeces on behalf of the owner (exhibitor);

Travelling Interstate

Alpacas travelling interstate must comply with that State's Department of Industry requirements.

Overnight facilities will be available Sunday night for exhibitors departing Monday morning. Please advise the Convenor when submitting entries if you intend stay overnight.

Period of Exhibition

Alpacas must be penned by **8.00pm** on Friday 20th August 2010 and **must not to be removed from the Exhibition Centre Venue until the completion of judging of ALL CLASSES and Official Closing Presentations on Sunday 22nd August 2010.**

Exhibitor who do not comply, remove any animals from the venue and depart the showground before the official closure will incur a \$150 penalty¹. It is with genuine regret that this paragraph has been included in this schedule. The Convenor and Chief Steward wish to make it quite clear that every effort is (and will be) made to keep the event program on time to ensure a reasonable departure time for **ALL** exhibitors. Unfortunately, some exhibitors still choose to test their abilities for a 'Great Escape'. This is deemed disrespectful to the judges, organisers and other competitors. It would be greatly appreciated if exhibitors did not put the Convenor in a position to implement this penalty.

The Convenor is the only person authorised to approve early departure. Only requests with exceptional circumstances will be considered.

Animals may be penned between 3pm – 8pm Friday 20th August 2010. Security will be provided for Friday & Saturday nights.

¹An exhibitor who is identified as removing animals from the venue and departing prior to the completion of judging and presentation to judges will incur a \$150 penalty which will be invoiced to the exhibitor. Non-payment will result in participation in future Victorian Alpaca Colourbration events being denied until the penalty is paid.

Exhibitors Meeting

The Chief Steward will determine the need for an exhibitor's meeting. Announcements for a meeting will be made on Friday evening/Saturday morning prior to showing.

Judging

Animal Judging. Animal Judging will commence at 9.00am Saturday and Sunday. A competitor may not discuss with the Judge their alpacas or proposed exhibits prior to, or during the Show. The judges' decision is final. He/she may choose not to award a prize or prizes in a class.

Date of shearing for both animal and fleece entries is now a requirement under AAA Ltd showing rules and must be included on entry forms.

Fleece Judging. Fleeces will be conducted on Friday 20th August 2010.

Fleece Deliveries. Fleeces must be delivered to or received by no later than Friday 13th August 2010. Fleeces not received by that date will be ineligible and Entry Fee will not be refunded.

All fleeces must be in a silk, satin or strong plastic bag with identification of Exhibitor, Exhibit and Class No.

To assist fleece exhibitors with submitting fleece entries, the following delivery methods are offered.

Dress Code

All attendants in the judging ring must wear white coats over long black trousers or long black skirts, with clean dress black shoes or boots.

Students from Catholic College Bendigo attending to animals in the judging ring must wear their approved dress attire.²

Where possible all junior handlers should wear a white coat over black trousers and hard boots. However, for exhibitor safety, a junior exhibitor of small stature is permitted to wear white long sleeved shirt over long black trousers; with clean dress black shoes or boots, when every effort to fit the child with a white coat has been demonstrated and failed. At no time is a child to wear an oversized adult white coat. Parents of Junior Exhibitors should consult the Convenor for any clarification prior to the event.

A handler will be deemed to be inappropriately attired if his/her dress or the animal being led displays any information capable of being construed as advertising for any stud.

The chief steward may disqualify anyone for incorrect attire. **Please note - Victorian Central Region no longer supply coats for hire – exhibitors are requested to provide their own.**

Exhibitors must display the exhibitor card as provided.

Stalls, Preparation of Exhibits and Cleanliness

Exhibitors must keep the stalls/pens allocated to their animals clean, and give proper attention to welfare of their stock throughout the show. Exhibitors must provide their own feed, feed and water containers. Exhibitors may be required to dismantle pens before departure. Straw will be provided.

Pen Safety

Penning used are standard 2.4m x1.2m sheep pens supplied by the local Agricultural Society. Each panel (excluding gate panels) has two (2) metal sections on top for inserting extension display boards (used by sheep breeders). The AAA VCR has a quantity of used tennis balls which are used to place over these metal sections for animal safety should one jump a panel.

The supply of tennis balls may be limited depending on the number of animals attending and will be supplied on a first in, as needed, basis until supply runs out. Exhibitors are encouraged to supply their own tennis balls (2 per panel) to guarantee their animals' protection. The balls will need to have a single hole (cross-cut) to place over the metal sections, and stud name/herd code is written on each ball for ownership identification.

Electric Fans/Electrical Appliances

Only power extension cables and distribution appliances tested and tagged by an electrician authorised by the Bendigo Exhibition Centre are to be used in the venue. Due to public safety requirements, power extension cables across public walkways will not be permitted. Therefore, power supply for use for electrical fans will be restricted and limited to availability from above girder columns; which will require professional installation and specialist lift equipment. Breeders requiring power for electrical fans must pre-book and pay for their power supply.

Cost for power & installation is \$75. Maximum two (2) fans. Payment to be included on the Payment Detail Form that accompanies the entry forms.

Breeders **MUST** ensure any personally-owned fans/electrical appliances have been tested by a qualified electrician and has a current compliance tag attached. Fans/appliances that do not have a current test and tag certification will not be permitted. Inspections will be conducted during the event.

Additional Feed Requirements

Lucerne and/or oaten hay can be made available for exhibitors not wanting to bring their own hay. Hay will be delivered to exhibitor pens on Friday. Bookings and payment arrangements can be made direct with Ian Whatley, Whatley Hay Suppliers (03) 5432 2217 or 0417 500 266.

Advertising

Show Pens. A 'show pen', at this event, is deemed 'a pen allocated to breeder to accommodate one or more animals entered for showing only'. Stud banners only are permitted but must be contained to the bounds of the pen and to a height of **1500mm** for pens allocated for show animals. For sale signs are not permitted. Display/promotional alpacas are not permitted. Ribbons won at any other previous show are not permitted.

For exhibitor and public safety, walkways are to be kept clear at all times.

Sale Pens. A 'sale pen', at this event, is deemed a 'paid commercial exhibit' pen. Only breeders who purchase an on-site sale pen/s and participates in the Event's Sale Catalogue under the terms for that catalogue will be permitted to promote their stock, stud and services within their allocated sale pen/exhibit area. For sale signs are permitted in this area. Promotional, sale material, and ribbons won at other previous shows are permitted. Only animals for sale and/or stud males listed in the event Sale Catalogue are permitted.

Any animals sold prior to the event can be replaced with another sale animal. Refer to Sale Catalogue Term and Conditions or contact Julie Wilkinson, Sale Coordinator, for details.

Breeders participating in both showing and sales will have all their stock accommodated in the same vicinity, but will be allocated separate show and sale pens. Above conditions apply to these pens. An animal entered for both showing and on-site sale is to be accommodated in the allocated sale/exhibit pen.

A maximum height limit of **1800mm** is permitted for promotional displays/banners for sale pens only and must not exceed the width of the allocated sale pen/s. Depending on pen layout and allocation, most pens will be freestanding and have no back wall/drop. Exhibitors must ensure all freestanding displays and banners are independently secured and do not inhibit animals or other exhibitor's displays.

Displays should be well presented, appropriate for intent of promoting the exhibitor's alpaca business.

Companion Animals

Special permission to bring a companion alpaca must be obtained from the Convenor or Chief Steward prior to submitting the entry forms; otherwise no companion animal will be permitted.

Inspection of Exhibits

All alpacas must be registered with the Australian Alpaca Association Ltd and carry an approved identification tag showing the alpaca's IAR number. Photocopies of AAA Certificates ARE NOT REQUIRED; however, exhibitors must check all details are correct. Any entry that is found to be grossly incorrect may not be accepted.

Inspection of alpacas will commence from 4pm Friday 20th August 2010.

When an exhibitor is ready to have their animals inspected they should report to the administration desk to arrange inspection. Inspections will be conducted in the animal's pen.

The Inspection Steward or Chief Steward will classify all entries for age, sex and colour and has the power to transfer an exhibit to the class which, in his/her opinion, it should have been entered. The Chief Steward will combine or split classes as he/she sees fit.

Huacaya must carry a minimum fleece length of 50mm and a recommended maximum length not exceeding 130mm. The minimum fleece length for Suris is 75mm and fleece length will be assessed by the judge.

All Huacaya must be shorn annually and not carry more than 15 months fleece and Suri must be shorn regularly so that no more than 24 months fleece is carried at the time of showing.

Exhibits shall not have fleece of a different colour to that of the blanket removed from an animal to a level below that of the blanket fleece.

Any alpaca found to have lice infestation must be removed from the showground immediately along with any other alpacas present that belong to the same exhibitor.

Cost of Entries

A separate entry is required for each stud/exhibitor. Multiple studs on one entry application are not permitted. In accordance with new showing rules, the date of shearing for both animal and fleece entries must be included with entry details.

³ An Authorised Agent' means the person authorised to enter animals and fleeces on behalf of the owner (exhibitor). An Authorised Agent representing a number of studs/exhibitors must submit separate applications for those studs/exhibitors.

Full payment must accompany entry forms. A separate Payment Details Form should accompany each entry form. Exhibitors are encouraged to retain a copy of this form with their entry form to use for accounting and tax purposes. Cheque payments are payable to 'AAA VCR Alpaca Colourbration'.

Volunteer Support – Reimbursement of Show Entries

Exhibitors (and non exhibitors) who volunteer to assist with the various areas of responsibilities will become eligible to have show entry fees reimbursed.

Details & Conditions.

- Four (4) Show Entry Reimbursement Tickets will be made available and names of all eligible volunteers will be placed in a raffle draw. Each ticket represents equivalent to two (2) animal show entries (2x\$27).
- Each volunteer must complete a Volunteer Support Form (download from Form Section Alpaca Colourbration website www.alpacacolourbration.com.au) and it **must be submitted with show entry forms before closing date 23 July 2010**
- Final consultation and rostering of positions will be made prior to the event and all volunteers will be advised of their positions and responsibilities.
- Volunteered positions must be fulfilled as agreed and rostered.
- Winners will be drawn at the end of day presentations on Sunday. The winner must be present at the drawing to receive the prize. Absence from draw will result in a redraw.
- A volunteer, who is not showing animals or fleeces and wins a Reimbursement Ticket, will be given the option to transfer/nominate another exhibitor to redeem the prize or choose to exchange the Reimbursement Ticket for an alternative prize to the equivalent value.

Other Promotional Activities

Alpaca Colourbration offers all participating breeders every opportunity to promote and market their stud and animals through other activities during and prior to the event. Other promotional opportunities such as:

- Sale catalogue (released 3 weeks prior to show to breeders in all Australian states plus New Zealand. (Two categories will be offered this year. Stay at Home animals and Sale Animals Attending. See Sale Catalogue documentation for details)
- Stud Male Listing (included in section of sale catalogue)
- Sale Pens
- Trade/Stud Display sites (opportunity to promote stud and stock)
- Living with Alpacas Media promotion (popular with exhibitors and general public)

It is only through these means that exhibitors will be able to **openly promote** their stud and/or animals for sale on site during the Alpaca Colourbration event. Consult the Forms Section on the Alpaca Colourbration website www.alpacacolourbration.com.au for further details.

Show Schedule

The following changes/additions have been made to the Victorian Alpaca Colourbration Carnival Showing Schedule for 2010.

1. Splitting of Coloured Shows (Animal & Fleece) (conditions apply):
 - a. Grey & Roan Huacaya
 - b. Grey & Roan Suri
 - c. Light Fawn & Medium to Dark Fawn Suri
2. Additional Mature Huacaya Fleece classes
3. Introduction of Sire Progeny Classes for each coloured show
4. Introduction of Junior Judging Competition
5. Introduction of Junior Handler event

Sire's Progeny Classes.

Sire's Progeny classes will be held at the conclusion of each respective coloured show. The colour of the progeny determines which coloured show the progeny are entered into. A sire that has progeny of more than one solid colour may be represented in more than one colour show. Two (2) animals per entry and a minimum of two (2) entries per sire progeny class. Entries must be submitted to the Stewards Desk before 9.00am on the day of the respective coloured show. No late entries will be accepted.

Junior Judging Competition

This competition to encourage and develop interest and involvement in alpacas by young people between 15 and 25 years of age will be conducted under AAA Ltd show conditions and evaluation carried out by an AAA Ltd accredited Judge (*the overjudge*).

Entry is FREE. Place ribbons and prizes will be awarded. Refer to Schedule and Junior Judging entry form for class details.

One class of four animals is judged by competitors.

There are two sections: visual and oral. Visual Judging Section takes place first followed by Oral Section.

Visual Section:

- Competitors are allowed five minutes to judge the four animals and to complete their placing card.
- The number of competitors required to present oral judgments is left to the discretion of the Chief Steward. Where the number of competitors is large, it may be appropriate to select the top eight visual class scorers.
- Competitors are scored on handling, general competence, ringcraft, presentation and dress.

Oral Section:

- Competitors are allowed three minutes to inform the overjudge of the reasons for their placings.
- Competitors are scored on accuracy of observation, ability to compare animals and speaking ability.

The total possible score is 150 points, made up of 50 points for correct placement of the four animals; (assessment taken from the Hormal Scale) 50 points for the visual and 50 points for oral presentation.

Junior Handler Competition

This competition is to educate and encourage junior exhibitors to parade exhibits before a judge in the most efficient manner.

Entry is FREE. Place ribbons and/or medallions will be awarded. Refer to Schedule and Junior Handler entry form for classes and details.

Entrants will be judged on presentation, knowledge of animal and ability to handle their animal. Refer to Dress Code for appropriate attire for junior handlers.

Junior Handlers' Competition is restricted to the age of 18 years, as at 1 Sep 2010

Protests

Only an exhibitor may lodge a protest against another exhibitor or a Show Official. The protest shall be lodged in writing together with a deposit of \$50, which shall be refunded if the protest is upheld. The sole grounds for a protet shall be a breach of the Show Rules.

Notice of protest shall be given to the Chief Steward within 10 minutes of the last alpaca being shown and the protest shall be formally lodged with the Chief Steward or Show Convenor, along with the deposit, within one hour of the end of the day's showing (when the last animal leaves the ring).

The Chief Steward or Show Convenor shall, prior to the commencement of the Show, establish a Protest Committee. The Committee shall comprise the Chief Steward as the Chair and two ordinary members. If an alleged incident occurred resulting in a protest in a class where the Chief Steward or other member of the Protest Committee was exhibiting or otherwise involved and his or her exhibit may have some bearing on the outcome of the protest then the Chief Steward or other member would stand aside and be replaced by the Show Convenor or another suitable member. A meeting will be convened within 30 minutes of the protest being received. The Protest Committee shall immediately investigate the protest and if found to be valid, initiate appropriate action.

Complaints against Judges are to be put in writing, within one week of the alleged incident, addressed to the AAA Ltd. National Secretary, c/- AAA Ltd. National Office accompanied by a \$50 fee, which will be refunded in the event that the complaint is upheld.
